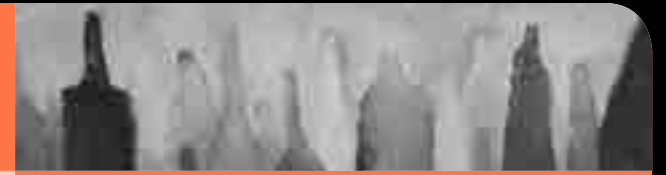

JavaScript is the language for building interactive web pages. The first step in translating a great design from the ground up starts with HTML and CSS. The next leap to take in the learning process is JavaScript. Developing interactive pages using JavaScript is now commonplace and a great skill to have for any web designer. This class will cover the fundamentals of JavaScript and how to make your web pages interactive. Topics will include AJAX, event handling, development tools and JavaScript libraries (pre-written code for easier development). The second half of the class will cover jQuery, one of the most popular libraries used to make programming easier for designers and developers. The course will also cover advanced CSS and HTML5 features that used to be exclusive to JavaScript but are now common features in modern browsers. All class activities will be hand-coded. *Pre-requisite: a full understanding of HTML and CSS.*

Because this workshop is focused on teaching techniques for digital painting in Photoshop, it is highly recommended that you are already familiar with Photoshop before getting started. This workshop will focus on using a landscape image for the class tutorial as opposed to a portrait photo. If you do not have an original landscape image, one will be provided by the instructor.

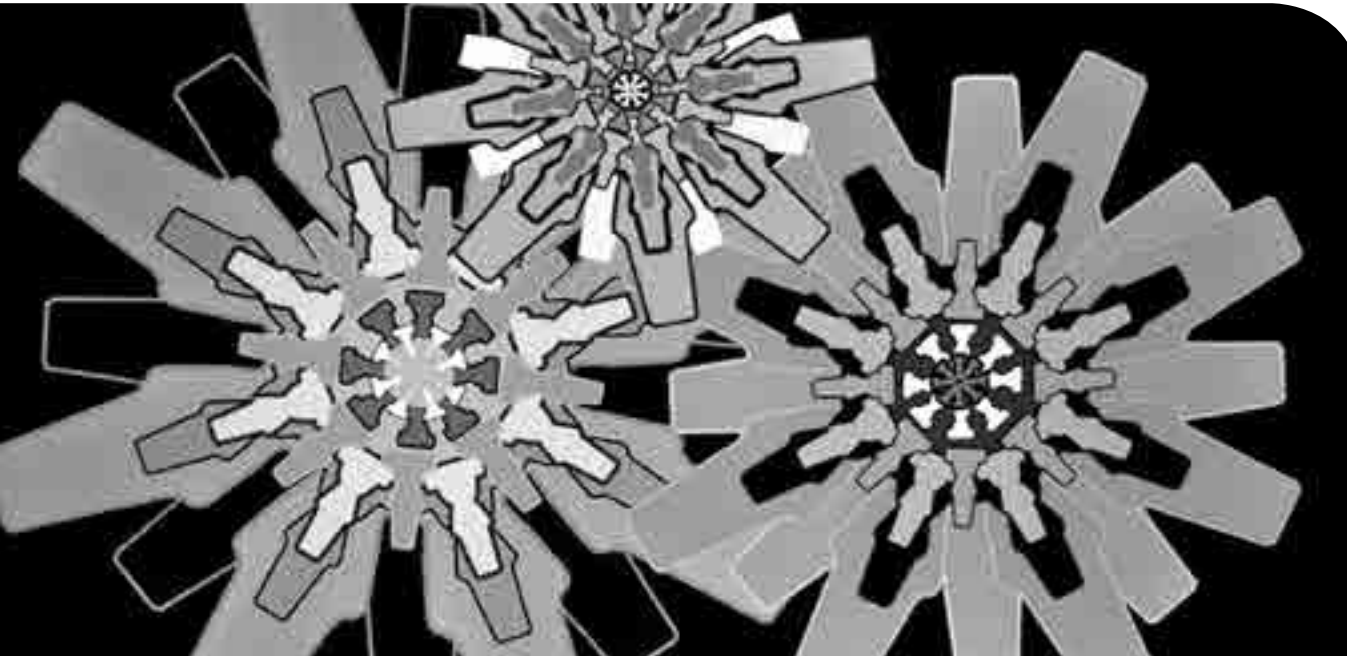

Born in Sofia, Bulgaria, he works in print making, drawing and children's book illustration. His work has been shown in solo, invitational and international exhibits. Since moving to the U.S. in 1990, Alexi has published more than 15 children's books with major American publishers, including Random House and Simon and Schuster. His work is on display at the National Art Gallery in Sofia, and The Rare Book Collection at the Princeton Library. His latest book is "Urso Brunov and The White Emperor," a collaboration with acclaimed writer Brian Jacques, world-renowned for The Red Wall series. Alexi has taught at Savannah College of Art and Design, the University of the Arts and the Maryland Institute College of Art.

KURT BRUGEL

Kurt Brugel creates strangely honest art. A lifelong resident of Wilmington, Delaware, Kurt was introduced to art at an early age. The Howard Pyle tradition has been the greatest and most continual influence on him. Kurt graduated from the Maryland Institute College of Art with a Fine Arts Degree in 1992. Kurt Brugel is a real guy, making real drawings. His primary focus in technique and medium is a pencil and a piece of paper, completing most works in colored pencils on toned papers.

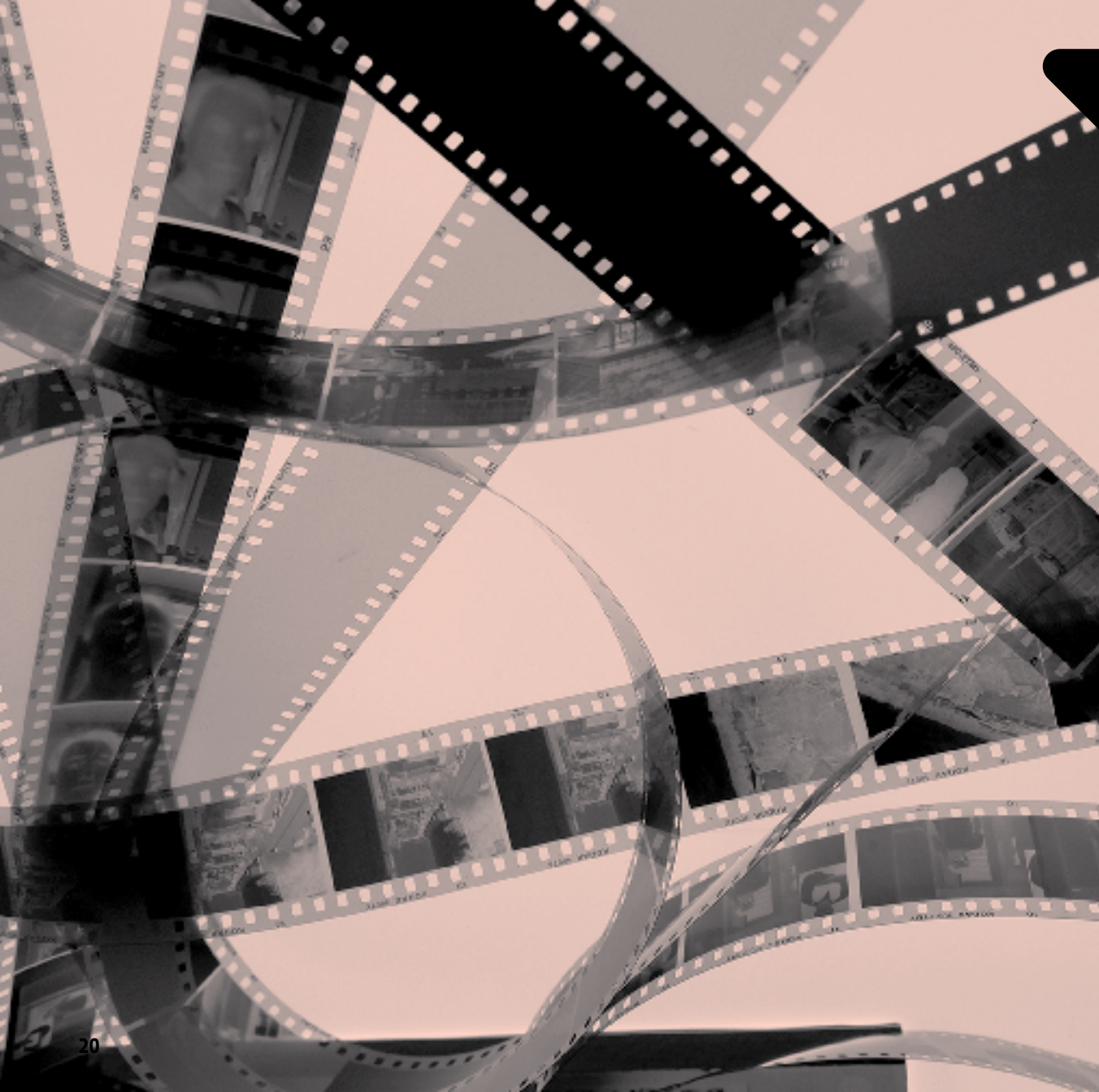

Students will be enrolled on a first-come, first-served basis.*



REGISTRATION

TUITION AND FEES

Tuition and lab fees (if applicable) are indicated as part of the course description. A non-refundable registration fee of \$25 is required each semester. Tuition and fees must be paid in full prior to the registration deadline. A fee of \$25 will be charged for returned checks and/or declined credit card charges. Students enrolling in an open studio class are not required to pay a registration fee and receive no grades or continuing education units.

NON-CREDIT COURSES & TUITION

Students who enroll in a non-credit Continuing Education course may request a Pass/Fail grade upon course completion. Students receive continuing education units (CEUS) upon successful completion of a class. CEUs are nationally recognized units earned by participation in qualified continuing education programs that document non-credit work completed. One CEU is awarded for every 10 hours of class participation. CEUs are not equivalent to college credits, and no letter grade or official transcript is provided for non-credit coursework.

CERTIFICATE FEE

All students who enroll in a Delaware College of Art and Design Certificate Program are required to pay a one-time \$75 certificate fee no later than their second semester of coursework.

Because the number of class sessions varies, the individual instructor determines the number of acceptable absences (if any) and has the final word on these matters.

TUITION ASSISTANCE

Students who live and/or work in Delaware may be eligible for tuition assistance through the State of Delaware Department of Education. Visit www.doe.k12.de.us and click “Students,” “Higher Education,” “Financial Aid” and then “Governor’s Education Grant for Working Adults.”

TUITION DISCOUNTS

A 10 percent discount on tuition only is available for: returning DCAD CE Students; DCAD AFA Alumni; High School Educators; students older than 60 years in age; and groups/corporations (five or more students). One discount per registration only. Discounts must be taken at the time of registration. Verification of eligibility for discounts will be required. Tuition discounts do not apply to lab fees, material fees or registration fees.

IRS EDUCATION CREDIT

If eligible, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) allows students to apply for educational credits. The Lifetime Learning Credit is a tax credit which may be available to help offset the cost of higher education by reducing the amount of your income tax. For more information regarding education credit, eligibility and instructions, please see IRS Publication 970, Tax Benefits for Education.

COURSE CANCELLATIONS AND CHANGES

The Delaware College of Art and Design reserves the right to cancel, close or reschedule any course due to insufficient enrollment or to change the instructor. In such a case, the student is entitled to a full refund of tuition and fees. Students will be notified of cancellations or changes as soon as possible and given the option of enrolling in a different class or receiving a full refund. Refunds will be processed within two weeks of the cancellation or change.

WITHDRAWALS AND REFUNDS

Withdrawal from a non-credit course must be done in writing to the director of Continuing Education. You may do so by email, fax or in person at the Delaware College of Art and Design. Lack of attendance, lack of course completion and/or notification to an instructor does not constitute withdrawal from a class. No registration fees will be refunded in the event of withdrawal.

REFUND FOR SIX OR MORE CLASS SESSIONS

If written notice is received – Before the first class meeting: 100 percent refund of tuition – Before the second class meeting: 75 percent refund of tuition.

REFUND FOR ONE TO FIVE CLASS SESSIONS

If written notice is received before the first class meeting 100 percent refund of tuition. Students will not be eligible for a tuition refund if they withdraw from a course after the first class meeting.

Registration requires acceptance of DCAD's Cancellation, Withdrawal and Refund Policy.
