Illustration I (IL 200, 3 credits)

Course Description:

This course offers an introduction to illustration, exploring the relationship between concept, text and image. Various illustrative approaches in relation to the existing markets are investigated. Traditional and digital black and white and color techniques are employed and related to the professional field of illustration and graphic design.

Prerequisite: Drawing II

Students will:

1. Develop conceptual skills as they relate to image making. (PC 1)
2. Incorporate design components such as format, layout, and typography in the illustration process (PC2)
3. Demonstrate the ability to research for inspiration, reference, accuracy, and professionally based solutions. (PC 3)
4. Develop a working familiarity with a variety of illustrative techniques and apply them to specific illustration projects. (PC2)
5. Employ basic awareness of professional ethics and practices. (PC 5)

Supplies: Total estimated cost \$250
